2016 Staff and Improvements

We've secured John Patrick from Cal Poly SLO to serve as our Chief Adjudicator, and Will Reilly from San Diego State will be leading tournament Tabulation. Based on your fantastic feedback we've made improvements to make your experience even better. This year we will provide all-day coffee, a continental breakfast each morning, and snacks throughout the day! We've also adjusted the schedule a bit to accommodate 6 (six) preliminary rounds and appropriate elimination rounds over a compact two-day schedule.

Recognition for Novices

The tournament offers WUDC style debate in one open division; however, please indicate at the time of registration which teams are novice teams so we can acknowledge them at the awards ceremony. For the purpose of the tournament, a "novice" is a student in his or her first year of intercollegiate academic debate, with no high school experience, who has not advanced to an elimination round in open division this year. If you're new to Worlds Debate, this is the perfect chance to give your team a taste of this popular new format. Please reach out to our tournament staff: we can supply resources and materials to help you prepare.

Registration and Fees

Registration for the event will begin on *forensicstournament.net* on November 15th, 2015, listed as: "2016 Steeltown Invitational (Worlds/BP)." Registration will close online on January 21st, 2016 at 5:00pm. At this time we anticipate no need for a team cap— register with impunity. Registration fees will be assessed at \$60 per team. An uncovered team entered in the tournament will be charged \$100 per uncovered team. A school fee of \$20 will also be charged. We can only accept cash or a check; please make checks payable to "Los Medanos College Foundation." We don't believe that financial considerations should restrict access to debate, so please reach out to our staff as soon as possible if these fees represent a burden to your squad.

Judging and Hired Judges

Each school must bring at least one judge to meet its judging requirement. For schools with more than one team entered, use the "**N-1 formula**" as indicated below. Schools with four or more teams entered may use the "N-2 formula."

Examples:

School A: One Team Entered, One Judge Needed

School B: Three Teams Entered, Two Judges Needed

School C: Five Teams Entered, Three Judges Needed

We anticipate the need to hire judges for the tournament.
