Dear Friends and Colleagues:

Orange Coast College and Mt. San Antonio College are pleased to invite you back to Southern California for our 4th annual "Close to the Coast" swing on January 23-24, 2016. This year's tournament will be held in Costa Mesa, CA on the beautiful campus of Orange Coast College. OCC and Mt. SAC have partnered up again to host this tournament in Southern California and give your teams an excellent January tournament in sunny* Southern California.

The two tournaments will offer similar schedules and fees. Both tournaments will have sweepstakes awards for the top three teams and top community college team. Both days will offer novice and open divisions in individual events and debate. We will award a top speaker of the swing tournament as well.

In addition to individual events we will host a one-day parliamentary debate tournament on Saturday and a one-day NFA-LD & IPDA debate tournament on Sunday. For both days the Open division will be a standard 4 prelims/2 elims format but in novice we will have a six prelim tournament with Gold/Silver/Bronze awards given to the top teams. NOTE: Students **may not** enter both debate and IE events on the same day. Students are more than welcome to mix and match on different days. OCC will be the official host on Saturday, and Mt. SAC will be the host on Sunday.

On Sunday, we will be implementing changes to both extemporaneous and impromptu speaking. For extemp finals, we will be adding a cross-examination period after each speech and for impromptu we will be using both traditional quotations and non-traditional prompts. Please see page 2 for more information.

TOURNAMENT INFORMATION:

- Postings will be at the Literature and Language Building and online
- Because of the swap meet on campus no parking is available in the Adams Lot. We recommend that you park in Lot E off Merrimac Way.

- Students from the host schools may compete both days, but will not be in the running for a team award the day their school is hosting.

SPEECH INFORMATION:

- Triple entry at your own risk. No triple-entry with extemp or duo. If students are found to triple enter with duo or extemp, the duo or extemp event will be dropped. Novices may not double-enter.
- AFA event descriptions will apply.
- Internet access is allowed in extemp prep.
- On Sunday only:
 - For impromptu, we will use AFA style with all speakers in a room given the same topic. Topics will be a mix of styles including quotations, scenarios, ethical dilemmas, etc.
 - For Extemp finals, we will add a two minute cross-examination period after each speech. The previous speaker will cross-examine the current speaker. So, speaker 1 will cross-examine speaker 2. Speaker 1 will be cross-examined by the last speaker in the round. Topic release time will be adjusted to take into account the additional question time. Judges are encouraged to take into account the speech and both cross-examination periods when ranking the students.

- Parliamentary Debate will be run in accordance with Phi Rho Pi rules. We will use topic strikes with 15
 minutes of preparation time. There will be no coaching during preparation time. Internet usage during debate
 preparation is allowed. There is <u>no</u> guarantee of access by the host. Brackets will be broken in Open division.
 All judge assignments will be at random. We will not offer elimination rounds in novice in lieu of all teams in
 novice debating a fifth and sixth preliminary round. Awards in novice will be based off preliminary rankings.
- OCC is a NPDA member school so the tournament will count towards NPDA season sweepstakes.
- Elimination rounds for open division will be on the Phi Rho Pi bronze/gold format. We will break an appropriate number of teams based on entry size (not to exceed half).
- No debate prep rooms will be made available. The government team may prepare in their competition room.
- Standard PSCFA definitions for novice debate eligibility will be used.
- We will try to adhere to the goal of using lay judges in both divisions of IPDA on Sunday.

JUDGING:

All judges must be available for all rounds.

- Individual Events One judge covers 5 total slots per pattern.
- Debate One judge covers 2 entries. Uncovered Debate entries must be approved by the Tournament Director before the entry deadline.

FEES (per tournament):

All Entries MUST be received by 5:00pm PST Tuesday, January 19, 2016. Fees are computed at that time. We will use <u>forensicstournament.net</u> for all entries.

Orange Coast College is located in Costa Mesa, CA at 2701 Fairview Road, Costa Mesa CA 92626.

- 1. In Costa Mesa, exit Harbor Boulevard, going south.
- 2. Proceed South on Harbor for just over ³/₄ of a mile to Merrimac Way.
- 3. Turn left (East) on Merrimac.
- 4. Orange Coast College is now on your left.
- 5. Turn left into Parking Lot E off of Merrimac. Parking is free on weekends.
