On behalf of University of California, Los Angeles and the UCLA Debate Union, you are cordially invited to attend the UCLA National Debate Invitational, featuring competition in the British Parliamentary format. The event provides an opportunity to participate in outstanding competition in the BP format.

The tournament features 6 preliminary debates and two elimination rounds. Like the California Cup co-sponsored by the UCLA Debate Union, the tournament will offer challenging competition, talented judging, a beautiful location and facilities, and a relaxed schedule and atmosphere.

Highlights

- No entry fees! But, you must cover your judging commitment. (N-1)
- A professionally led tournament, held in one building, and that is designed to run on time.
- John Patrick, of Cal Poly SLO, will administer our tab room so your teams will debate high quality, well thought-out motions.
- A variety of excellent restaurants including an In-N-Out in nearby Westwood.
- Oral adjudication in all debate rounds
- Weather that is likely to be in the mid-60s to mid-70s.

Tournament

The tournament offers British Parliamentary debate; the format used at the WUDC and USUDC tournaments, and will be following the international guidelines for WUDC competition including consensus judging, individual preparation and the international 4-team 8- speaker format.

- Indicate if you must hire a judge. One judge covers two teams.

Fees

Registration is open now through **Wednesday, November 18, 6pm PST**. There are no entry fees! However you must cover your judging commitment. (N-1)

The hired judging fee is \$150 per judge. There is an additional \$150 fee for any team leaving the tournament prior to completion of preliminary debates. We accept cash and checks. All **checks** should be made payable to the **Regents of the University of California**. All fees are due no later than morning registration.



Judging

Each school must provide (N-1) judges where N is the number of teams entered. We are also looking for judge volunteers and may have some money available for the hiring of judges. If that interests you, contact the Tournament Director at profmiller@speech.ucla.edu or (310)-709-1997.

Lodging

There is no official tournament hotel. However, there are excellent hotels and values near LAX airport, and in Westchester and Culver City area. Air Travel Information

If you are arriving by air, you should make arrangements to arrive at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX). LAX is only 25-30 minutes from UCLA. Taxi and shuttle transportation is approximately \$35-40. UBER is around \$25.00.

Driving Directions to UCLA

UCLA is located at 405 Hilgard, Los Angeles, CA 90095. From the 405 Freeway, exit on Sunset Blvd. Go east on Sunset to Hilgard Ave. Right on Hilgard Ave then another right into UCLA. Make a right turn on Young Drive and proceed to LOT # 3. Parking is \$12.00 per day. Proceed south from the parking structure to the Luskin Public Affairs Building, Room 2270. It is the large 4-story building. The tournament will take place both days, entirely on the second floor of Luskin.
