

2017 University of Utah/California State University-Long Beach Utah/Long Beach IE/NFA-LD Swing

Dear Friends,

On behalf of the University of Utah and California State University, Long Beach, we invite you to return to the Mountain West for the Utah/Long Beach Classic held at the University of Utah. The tournament will be held on January 6-7, 2017. From our Olympic ski resorts to the acres of snowshoeing country, Utah is sure to offer you a range of activities. On Friday, January 6, 2017, the Great Salt Lake IE Classic will offer a four-round NFA Lincoln-Douglas tournament and a two-round individual events tournament. The Long Beach Classic will be held on January 7th. The LB Classic will feature a four-round NFA Lincoln-Douglas tournament and a two-round individual events tournament.

SPECIAL NOTE: The University of Utah and Texas Tech University will be hosting the Mile High NPDA swing concurrent with the Utah/Long Beach IE Swing on the University of Utah Campus. The schedule has been arranged to allow full-service teams to split their competition between halves (e.g., PARLI/PARLI, PARLI/IE, or IE/IE). PLEASE NOTE: IE competitors wishing to compete in PARLI, must compete in IE's in the second half (Sat) of the IE swing (and compete in PARLI on Thu/Fri) due to scheduling constraints. Tournament Information:

<u>Rules:</u> AFA IE and NFA LD regulations will be in effect for relevant events, unless otherwise specified in this invitation.

<u>Competitor Eligibility:</u> Tournaments are open to any regularly enrolled undergraduate in a two year or four year college or university in good standing with the school's speech team/club. As the tournaments run back-to-back, students may (and are encouraged to) attend both tournaments. Students must also meet the eligibility guidelines of the AFA or NFA in order to compete.

<u>Entry Procedure:</u> Both the Utah and Long Beach portions of the Swing will be using <u>www.forensicstournament.net</u> exclusively for entries. Entries must be completed by 5:00 PM MST on Monday, January 2nd, 2017. Drops and name changes (but not adds) can be entered no later than 11:59PM MST on Wednesday, January 4th, 2017. Drops after this deadline will be treated as "no-shows."

Individual Events:

<u>Events offered</u>: Students <u>may not</u> enter in more than <u>3</u> events per pattern. Students may not enter in both AFA IEs and NFA-LD. It is the sole responsibility of the competitors to complete all events in the time given. Failure to do so will result in a no-show score for the round. We will offer the following events:

Pattern A – Extemp, Informative, After Dinner Speaking, Prose, and Poetry Pattern B – Impromptu, Persuasive, Communication Analysis, Duo, Dramatic, and POI

Divisions: We plan to offer a single, OPEN division.

<u>Elimination Rounds</u>: Any event with 7 contestants or fewer will not have a final round. For events with more than 7 competitors, a final round will be held. Any event with more than 36 entries will advance to semifinals.

<u>Advancing to Elimination Rounds:</u> No more than half of the field will be advanced to finals. Students will be rank ordered first by cumulative rankings, then by the highest speaker points. All attempts will be made to make a clean break (by cumulative rankings).

<u>Placement in Elimination Rounds</u>: Students will be rank ordered first by cumulative rankings (with exception for majority first place rankings), then by judge's preference, followed by the highest reciprocal score (decimal conversion), and finally by the highest cumulative ratings.

NFA LD Debate

Divisions: We plan to offer a single, OPEN division.

<u>Procedural Issues</u>: NFA L/D Debate is a communication event that is debated in a stock issues paradigm. In deference to the intent of the event, we ask that all competitors and critics are mindful of these rules. Complete rules can be found at http://www.nationalforensics.org. MPJ will not be offered; judges will be randomly assigned.

<u>Double Entry</u>: At both halves of the swing, competitors may enter EITHER NFA DEBATE OR INDIVIDUAL EVENTS, not both.

<u>Disclosure</u>: Following the return of the ballot, critics may disclose as much or as little information as they see fit so long as it does not interfere with the tournament schedule. Delays caused by coaches/judges may, at the tournament director's discretion, result in penalties to that school's teams including removal from the tournament. We don't want to do it, so don't put us in a position where we would want to do it. NOTE TO JUDGES: All rounds must have one winner and one loser.

<u>Preliminary Rounds:</u> The computer will randomly match Round One. Subsequent rounds will be power-matched high-low.

<u>Elimination Rounds</u>: Advancement to and seeding in elimination rounds will be first based upon wins, followed by total speaker points, followed by opposition record, then adjusted speaker points, and finally by ZScore. In elimination rounds, brackets **WILL be broken**.

Financial Information

<u>Entry Fees:</u> The fee schedule is the same for both tournaments. You may, at your option, pay with TWO checks, one for the Great Salt Lake Invitational and one for the Long Beach Classic, or ONE check for both tournaments. All checks MUST be made payable to University of Utah - Debate. Fees will be assessed at 5:00 pm MST on Monday, January 2nd, 2017. Drop fees and "no show" fees will be in addition to fees as assessed at this time. The fee schedule is as follows (all fees per tournament):

So, that means that if you were entering 2 NFA-LD and 5 IE entries (none of which are Duo) for both halves of the swing your total cost would be \$280.00 (\$40.00 school fee x 2 [GSL and Long Beach] + \$100 GSL entry fees [2 debate entries x \$25 + 5 IE entries x \$10 = \$50] + \$100 Long Beach entry fees [2 debate entries x <math>\$50 + 5 IE entries x \$10 = \$50] = \$280 Total Swing Cost).

<u>Judging:</u> One judge can cover up to 6 IE slots per pattern, or up to 2 NFA LD entries. Judges can cover EITHER LD and IE entries, NOT BOTH, because they run concurrently. Debate judges are committed through the first full outround and one round beyond their debater's

elimination. An I.E. judge is committed through finals. Meeting this commitment is <u>essential</u> in order for the tournament to run. Judges wishing to judge beyond their commitment should notify the Tournament director. Compensation may be available. Your generosity will be most appreciated.

<u>Uncovered Fees</u>: First and foremost, please, please, please, bring your judges. We only have a limited pool of available judges to hire. Uncovered judge fees will be assessed on the following basis:

***Fees will be assessed at both halves of the swing.

Tournament Awards

<u>AFA Individual Events Awards:</u> We will offer awards for the first three finishers, with t-shirts for finalists and semifinalists. In addition, we will once again award the prestigious Royal L. Garff Speaker of the Year Trophy.

<u>The Royal L. Garff Award</u>: The top overall competitor in AFA Individual Events at the GSL will be awarded the Royal Garff Award, a traveling trophy given out each year. The award was created in 1997 in memory of Prof. Royal Garff, a lifetime supporter of public speaking, forensics, and public debate. The trophy has been awarded at every GSL since 1997 and continues to honor the achievements of students who compete in short prep, platforms and interpretation events. The winner of the Garff Award will be determined based off the highest total accumulated in up to six events using the following scale: 1^{st} place = 10 pts, 2^{nd} place = 7 pts, 3^{rd} place = 5 pts, Finalist = 3 pts. Please note: Only students who compete in all three genres (interp, platform, and short prep) are eligible for the Garff Award.

<u>Sweepstakes:</u> The top two schools at each tournament, as well as the top three schools competing in the swing will receive sweepstakes trophies.

Calculating Sweeps:

Individual Events - Sweepstakes points will be issued to all participants in semifinals and finals based on the following scale. No points will be given for preliminary rounds. Only entries in the Open division will be counted toward tournament sweepstakes.

NFA LD Debate - Only entries in the Open division will be counted toward tournament sweepstakes.

Equalization of Debate and Individual Events - For team sweepstakes for both tournaments, debate and individual events will be equalized. This equalization is achieved by the use of percentiles. All sweepstakes points earned by all debate teams/entries are summed. The points earned by each squad are divided by the total number of points earned in debate in order to determine what percentage of all debate points were earned by the team. Similarly, all sweepstakes points earned by all individual events competitors are summed. A similar percentile score is calculated in individual events for each squad.

The two percentile scores for a school (debate and IE) are added together in order to determine an equalized aggregate sweepstakes score. Assuming a school earned all of the possible sweepstakes points in the tournament (a mathematical impossibility), the maximum score they could earn would be 200 points (100% for debate, and 100% for IE).

For swing sweepstakes, points from both tournaments are pooled to determine the winners.

Lodging:

We have secured a room block and will be hosting registration at the Crystal Inn Hotel & Suites – Salt Lake City. The tournament hotel is located in downtown Salt Lake City and boasts convenient access to/from the University by TRAX, our local light rail.

Driving Directions

<u>From the Airport:</u> Out of airport, follow signs toward Park City/Cheyenne. You will pass through downtown on the freeway as it curves right and then left. When you arrive at 1300E, exit the freeway and turn left onto 1300E. Go north until you reach 100S and turn right at the northwest corner of campus. Follow this street onto the U of Utah campus. The street winds around the north side of campus (it changes as it winds, ending up as North Campus Drive). Take a right following signs to Olpin Union or OSH (Orson Spencer Hall, the Tournament HQ), the Street is Central Campus Drive. *Parking fees will be assessed by the University on Friday; the weekend is free in any lot, unless otherwise marked*.

From the Hotel: From the Crystal Inn, turn right out of the parking lot onto 500 South. Then, turn right on 300 West and then right onto 400 South. Continue on 400 South, noting that it will curve to the right and then to the left as you head up the hill. When you reach the top, turn left onto 1300 East. Take 1300 East until you reach 100 South; turn right onto 100 South. Follow this street onto the U of Utah campus. The street winds around the north side of campus (it changes as it winds, ending up as North Campus Drive). Take a right following signs to Olpin Union or OSH (Orson Spencer Hall, the Tournament HQ), the Street is Central Campus Drive. *Parking fees will be assessed by the University on weekdays; the weekend is free in any lot, unless otherwise marked*.

From Airport to Hotel: Exit the airport and head on I-80 east toward downtown/Park City/Cheyenne. You will curve through downtown reaching an exit for 600 South. Exit here. Immediately upon exit you will arrive at 200 West, turn left. When you reach 500 South, turn left. You will see the Crystal Inn to your right as you head west on 500 South.
