2016 CALIFORNIA CUP DEBATE CHAMPIONSHIP 1 – Hosted at USC by the Trojan Debate Squad, Friday 18, 2016



Dear Colleagues:

On behalf of the Trojan Debate Squad, the Annenberg School for Communication and Journalism and the University of Southern California, you are cordially invited to attend SEP the 2016 California Cup Debate Championship, featuring competition in the British parliamentary format. The tournament will be held at USC. This tournament is the first stage of the California Cup, a series of debate tournaments held on the weekend of November 18-20 in the greater Los Angeles region. UCLA will host on Saturday and Claremont McKenna College will host on Sunday.

Competition format: The tournament will offer a single division of British Parliamentary debate the format used at the WUDC and USUC tournaments, and will be following the international guidelines for WUDC competition including consensus judge and the international 4-team and 8-speaker format. The event includes oral disclosure and constructive feedback

in all debates; position equalization as appropriate.

Tournament registration: Registration is now open. Participants must attend an accredited degree-granting post-secondary institution. If an individual attends more than one institution, he or she must register as a participant for the institution granting the higher degree. Hybrid teams are not eligible to participate. Entries will be accepted until we reach the entry cap of 52 teams or on November 16 at 6 pm pst. To enter just email stables@usc.edu and provide:

judge who can chair a panel. Please mark 'chair' or 'wing' for each judge.

You will receive a confirmation email. Please contact us if you don't receive a confirmation.

Fees: There are no entry fees. If a school cannot hire a judge, we can provide a very limited number of hired judges at \$150 each. Each hired judge covers two team entries. Payment should be made to USC Annenberg Trojan Debate Squad.

Judging: Each school must provide (N-1) judges where N is the number of teams entered. Judges interested in being hired by the tournament should contact us at stables@usc.edu. Please note any judging conflicts. It is possible that judges may evaluate their own.

Lodging: Because there is both a USC home football game on Saturday and a Los Angeles Rams game (which also takes place on campus) on Sunday, we strongly recommend that tournament guests stay in hotels closer to the other tournament stages. If you want to stay closer to USC on Thursday evening (prior to the debates at USC), we recommend you stay in one of the many downtown hotels. Please contact us if you have specific hotel needs.

Getting to USC:

Debates will be held on USC's main (University Park) campus. Driving directions are available at https://visit.usc.edu/mapsdirections/university-park-campus/directions-to-uscs-mainentrance/ Please allow extra time for your Friday morning commute.

Parking: Enter campus at the entrance on Vermont Avenue and 36th place. All guests will need to purchase a daily parking pass (for \$12) at the entry gate. A parking deck is immediately on your right after you acquire your parking pass. Once you park, walk on Downey Way toward the center of campus (away from you entered) and make a left turn on Watt Way. Wallis Annenberg Hall will be immediately on your right.

Metro: We also encourage guests to consider using the LA Metro light rail service to campus. The Expo Line stops on campus at the Expo Park/USC. You can use this service to connect with Santa Monica, Long Beach, Redondo Beach, Pasadena, downtown LA, and stops across the San Fernando and San Gabriel Valleys. Plan your specific trip at https://trips.metro.net/tm_pub_start.php If you metro, just exit the Expo Park stop and walk straight onto campus using Trousdale Parkway. Make a left on Childs Ways and Wallis Annenberg Hall will be on your left, immediately after the bookstore and Tudor Campus Center.

Registration, location of debates and motion announcements - All debates will be held in our two Annenberg School buildings, Wallis Annenberg Hall (ANN on campus maps) and The Annenberg School of Communication (ASC). A full campus map

is available at http://web- app.usc.edu/maps/#upc The opening check-in and motion announcement will take place in Wallis Annenberg Hall's auditorium (L105A). Registration will take place outside the auditorium. This is one floor below the ground level when you enter the building.

Air Travel Information

If you are arriving by air, you should make arrangements to arrive at Los Angeles International Airport (LAX). LAX is only 25F30 minutes from UCLA. Taxi and shuttle transportation is approximately \$35F40. UBER is around \$25.00.

Driving Directions to UCLA

UCLA is located at 405 Hilgard, Los Angeles, CA 90095. From the 405 Freeway, exit on Sunset Blvd. Go east on Sunset to Hilgard Ave. Right on Hilgard Ave then another right into UCLA. Make a right turn on Young Drive and proceed to LOT # 3. You must pay for parking. Proceed south from the parking structure to the Luskin Public Affairs Building, Room 2270. It is the large 4Fstory building. The tournament will take place both days, entirely on the second floor of Luskin.

1. Team Entries

Registration dates and deadlines Entries are open and close Wednesday, November 16, 2016, 6:00 PM

(PST). <u>Tournament registration takes place in Bauer Forum, 8:15-8:30</u> <u>AM.</u>

You will receive an email confirmation within 48 hours. Please confirm all entries by email or telephone if you do not receive entry verification.

Eligibility to register Participants must attend an accredited degreegranting post-secondary institution. If an individual attends more than one institution, he or she must register as a participant for the institution granting the higher degree. Hybrid teams are not eligible to participate.

2. Judging <u>N-1</u> applies. <u>Designate</u> chair and wing judges with entry. <u>Note</u> any judging conflicts. It is possible that judges may evaluate their own teams (conventional at one-day Southern California tournaments, although a lower preference – this practice has been a desirable feature of local debating for many years).

3. Debate Rules and Awards In general, the tournament will follow WUDC guidelines. The event includes oral disclosure and constructive feedback in **all** debates; position equalization as appropriate. Any rule modification is made to ensure that tournament awards are meritbased (as opposed to chance).

4. Awards Yes. An appropriate number. In rank order.

5. Amenities Debates will be held indoors. Classrooms are clean. Restrooms are available. Likely to have sunny weather. Door prizes. Snacks throughout the day. Water.

6. Day of Tournament registration Financial Registration will take place in Bauer Forum, Claremont McKenna College. Registration is

8:15 – 8:30 AM. Directions to registration are included. All outstanding fees must be paid at this time.

7. Travel

<u>Airport:</u> Closest airport is Ontario Airport, located about 10-12 minutes from the campus. Although it is likely that out-of-town travelers will arrive at LAX, it may be convenient or less expensive to depart from Ontario.

Driving Directions: To reach Claremont McKenna College: Take the San Bernardino Freeway (I-10) to Indian Hill Boulevard (Exit 47). Drive north on Indian Hill Boulevard for approximately 1 mile to the Arrow Highway. Proceed right to Claremont Boulevard (second light). Left on Claremont Boulevard for 3/4 mile to the college entrance at 9th Street. You may park in the second parking lot on the left – the lot closest to the campus entrance. You may park in any legal spot (fine to park in college spaces except for designated carpool spots; may not park in 'illegal' spaces, i.e., disabled without appropriate placard, fire lane, loading zone, etc.) Bauer Center is directly west of this parking lot (the same direction that you drove into the campus). The entrance to Bauer Forum is next to the nearest lot; if approached from the other side of the building, it is located on the main floor of the circular, southern section of Bauer Center.

Accommodation Information: There are excellent hotels and values at LA/Ontario Airport, noted on myriad websites. These hotels are approximately 10-15 minutes from the campus by freeway. For those interested in options in Claremont: The Doubletree is located at 555 W. Foothill Boulevard at Indian Hill Boulevard, (Hilton's 800 registration; Claremont Lodge, 736 S. Indian Hill Boulevard, Claremont, (909) 626-5654; The Hotel Claremont (formerly the Ramada Inn, approximately \$65-85 per single/double), 840 S. Indian Hill Boulevard, Claremont, (909) 621-4831; and Howard Johnson Express Inn, (approximately \$65-85 per single/double), 721 S. Indian Hill Boulevard, (909) 626-2431. With the exception of the Doubletree Hotel, these hotels are at the intersection of I-10 and Indian Hill Boulevard. The Hotel Claremont is south of the freeway; the other hotels are located north of the freeway. There are restaurants clustered near these hotels. These are located about 3 miles from the campus.
