# L.E. Norton Memorial

## Information and Procedures

#### **RULES and GUIDELINES:**

1. The L.E. Norton Memorial will adhere to the ethical standards and event descriptions of the American Forensic Association National Individual Events Tournament. They can be accessed online at afaniet.org. All judges AND competitors are expected to be aware of and well-versed in these standards. Bradley University guest access to WIFI will be offered for Extemp, but online access and quality will not be guaranteed by the tournament.

2. The <u>Varsity</u> Extemporaneous Speaking final round will feature an open cross-examination period of 2 minutes. Each speaker will be questioned by the previous speaker, with the last speaker questioning the first speaker. Contestants who will cross-examine the speaker are required to watch the speech and are permitted to take notes during the speech. We ask that all finalists report to draw first so that speaker order can be assigned to accommodate multiple entries and the questioning period. It is at the judges' discretion to include or not to include the cross-examination period in their ranking of the round.

3. No material may have been performed by a student in any competition (high school or college) prior to this academic year (2018-2019). Students in violation of this rule will be disqualified.

4. Tabulation procedures will be similar to AFA-NIET practices where applicable sans majority of 1's.

5. A variation from the AFA-NIET rules:

-Impromptu Speaking rounds may use non-traditional prompts for some rounds of competition.

#### **REGISTRATION:**

1. Novice divisions will be offered in events containing at least 35 varsity entries and at least 12 novice entries. *Novice* designates <u>students from four year schools</u> with NO intercollegiate forensics experience prior to August 1, 2018 <u>and any students from two year schools/community colleges</u>. In other words, *novice* categories are open to 4-year students in their first year of competition and any two-year student.

2. Each school may enter an unlimited number of students per event.

3. Each student may enter a maximum of two events per group. Two duos count as two events.

**GROUP A:** Impromptu Speaking Informative Speaking Prose Interpretation **GROUP B:** Duo Interpretation Extemporaneous Speaking Persuasive Speaking Program Oral Interpretation **GROUP C:** After Dinner Speaking Communication Analysis Dramatic Interpretation Poetry Interpretation

4. Semi-Finals will be held for events containing over 60 entries. Quarter-Finals will be held for events containing at least 120 entries.

 Entries must be submitted via Speechwire.com. Entries must be received by 12:00 p.m. (noon), CST, Tuesday, October 30, 2018. No additions will be accepted after this time. Drops can be made on Speechwire.com until noon on Wednesday, October 31<sup>st</sup> at which point entries and fees will be assessed.

#### AWARDS:

1. Individual event trophies will be awarded to the top six competitors and semi-finalists in each event (Both Novice and Varsity).

2. Team trophies will be awarded to the top five schools in both open and 2-year team sweepstakes.

3. Pentathlon trophies will be awarded to the top five speakers of the tournament, in both novice and open categories (if there are at least 5 entries in each category). To be eligible for open Pentathlon, a student must compete in at least five open events. Two Duos WILL count as two events in Pentathlon. Points are based on elimination rounds only. The student's five best events will be tabulated for Pentathlon points. If entries warrant, we will also offer awards for novice (2-year) Pentathlon. Only students whose five events are novice will be eligible.

4. Team sweepstakes and Pentathlon are calculated according to the following point scale.

*12 points:	1st place in varsity final	*6 points:	1st place in novice final
*10 points:	2nd place in varsity final	*5 points:	2nd place in novice final
*8 points:	3rd place in varsity final	*4 points:	3rd place in novice final
*6 points:	4th place in varsity final	*3 points:	4th place in novice final
*4 points:	5th place in varsity final	*2 points:	5th place in novice final
*2 points:	6th/7th place in varsity final	*1 point:	6th/7th place in novice

#### \*1 point: Non-advancing elimination (varsity and novice)

#### FEES:

- 1. A fee of \$15 will be charged for each entry slot.
- One judge is needed for every six slots entered. Judges may be hired for an additional \$10 per slot not covered by your school. Hired judges will be paid \$10 per round.
  *Please note:* Any school bringing a Bradley Alumnus as a judge will have that judge cover 10 slots rather than the typical six. It is your responsibility to register any alumni judges.
- 3. Drop penalties are as follows:

-NO CHARGE for drops up to 12:00 noon CST, Wednesday, October 31, 2018. -\$15 charge per dropped or changed slot plus original entry fee, \$30 per dropped judge plus new uncovered slots after 12:00 noon CST, Wednesday, October 31, 2018 until 5:00pm CST, Thursday, November 1, 2018. -\$25 charge per dropped slot and \$75 charge per dropped judge after 5:00pm CST, Thursday, November 1, 2018.
